### **Sir Peter Welcomes ACP and EC Delegates**

Chairman of the PNG Events Council, Sir Peter Barter assured the delegates to the African Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) group of states and the European Commission (EC) Council of Ministers meetings that Papua New Guinea is looking forward to welcoming them at the end of May.

Sir Peter also announced a trade, tourism and investment display planned for May 28<sup>th</sup> to June 2<sup>nd</sup> 2006.

Provincial governments and administrators have been invited to participate with their people and businesses to show their principle industries and cultural heritage.

Provinces have been given the option to build their traditional house at the Sir John Guise Stadium.

Sir Peter has also invited the Opposition Leader, Peter O'Neil to participate and show the cultural strength of his Ialibu people and the contribution made by the petroleum and gas industries in the Southern highlands province.

### **MSG Countries Invited to Participate**

Member countries of the Melanesian Spearhead Group, Solomon Islands, Fiji and Vanuatu have been encouraged to participate in this cultural and trade display. Foreign Minister Sir Rabbie Namaliu extended the invitation during his visit to Vanuatu this month.

### **Port Moresby City Prepares for Visitors**

The National Capital District Commission has started a major clean up campaign in the city. Street vendors and betelnut sellers have been encouraged to operate within the city regulations on where they can sell their wares. The greening of the Waigani, Gordons area has been completed and repairs to the roads are continuing.

### **Provinces Will Participate in Village Concept**

Some provincial governments have already committed funds to support the PNG Village Concept. Governor of Enga, Peter Ipatas was the first to respond with a cheque for K30,000. This money will be used to construct a building from Enga and the province's participation at this event.

## **Bougainville Enthusiastic about Cultural Display**

Bougainville has responded positively to the invitation to participate in the Village Concept. Provincial Administrator, Peter Tsiamalili thanked the Chairman of the PNG Events Council, Sir Peter Barter for inviting his province to a meeting for the New Guinea Islands region to discuss the Village Concept. Bougainville is keen in showing its rich cultural diversity by constructing a traditional house and displaying a special canoe. The deputy administrator Patrick Koles attended the meeting and conveyed the administrators commitment.

## **East New Britain Supports Concept**

Governor of East New Britain, Leo Dion has indicated his provinces support for the preparations in showcasing Papua New Guinea's diverse culture and investment potential during the ACP -EC Council of Ministers meetings. Governor of East New Britain Leo Dion was represented by his executive officer, Timothy Masiu, at the briefing for the New Guinea Islands region in Kokopo. He conveyed Mr. Dion's support. East New Britain is one of the provinces which has benefited a lot in project funding from the European Union. Some of the EU funding covered water projects and rehabilitation of educational institutions implemented by the Gazelle Restoration Authority.

## **East Sepik to Participate**

The East Sepik Province will build a *haus tambaran* and participate in showcasing the province. Acting administrator John Alman notified the PNG Events Council Secretariat this week of his province's commitment to the efforts by the government in making the ACP and EC Council of Ministers Meetings a success. The province will also be contributing K30,000 to the PNG Village Concept.

## **Gulf and Oro Travel to Port Moresby for Briefing**

The provincial administrators of Gulf and Oro traveled to Port Moresby to be briefed by the Coordinator Alan Oaisa about their participation in the trade and cultural exhibition. They will discuss their provinces' participation with their departments and advise the PNGEC on their position. Both provinces support the national government's initiative in inviting provinces to participate and display their unique features.

## **Refurbishment at the Conference Venue**

Work on refurbishing the conference venue at the Indoor Sports Complex is progressing well. The landscaping of the grounds is almost completed and the major work in carpeting air-conditioning of the main conference venue is progressing. The painting and carpentry work in the offices and the main conference venue is nearing completion.
